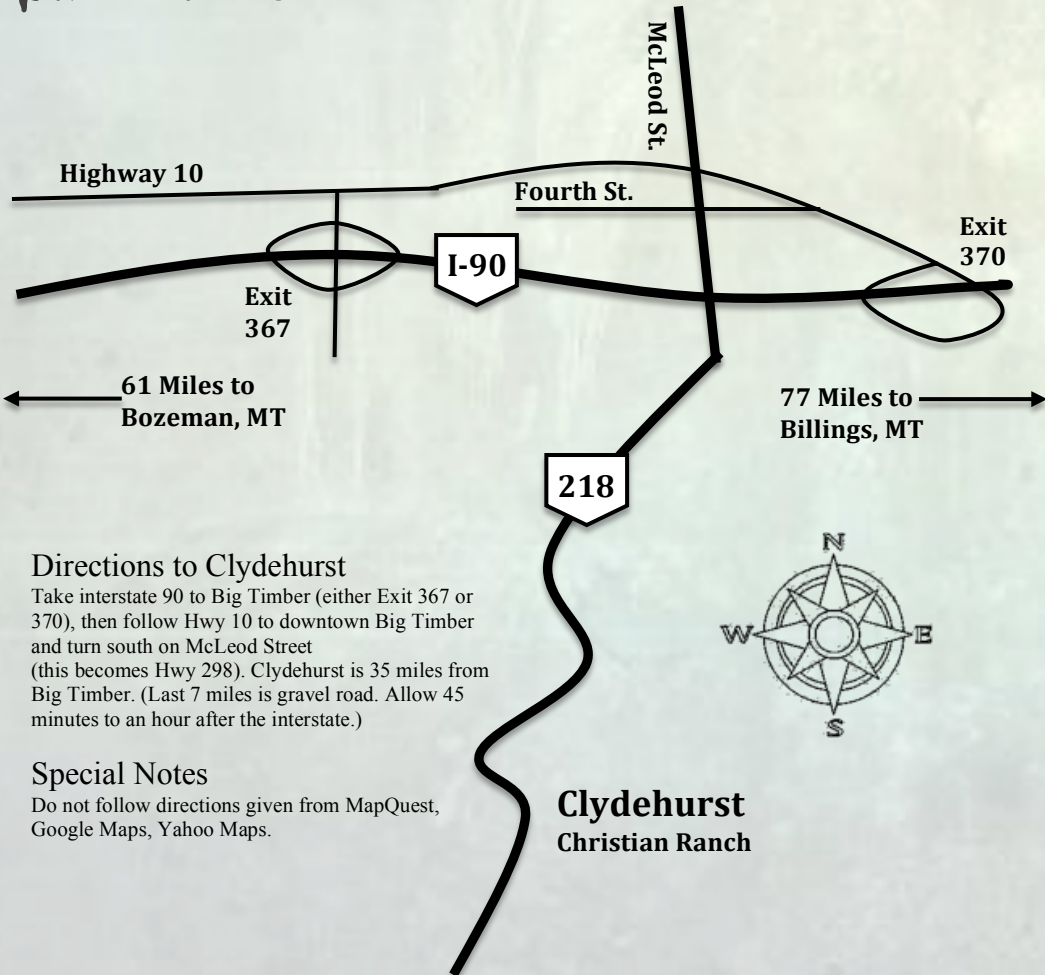

BILLINGS: Bus leaves the K-Mart parking lot at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, and return to K-Mart on the following Saturday between 11:30 and 12:00 noon.

BOZEMAN: Bus leaves the K-Mart parking lot at 2:15 p.m. on Sunday and returns to K-Mart on the following Saturday between 11:15-11:45 a.m.

Check-in at camp is between 3:00 - 5:00 p.m. on Sunday afternoons. All campers *not* riding busses need to be picked up promptly at 9:00 a.m. Saturday.

Robbie Robison

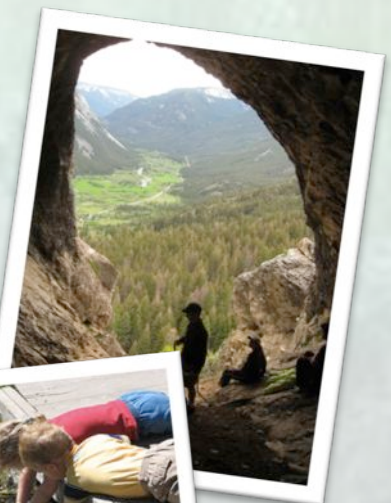

Frequently Asked Questions

- **When does the bus leave on Sunday for youth camp at Clydehurst?** The bus leaves Billings at 2:00pm and Bozeman 2:15pm on Sunday, both from their respective K-Mart parking lots.
- **When does the bus leave and return on Saturday morning?** The bus leaves Clydehurst at 9am and returns to the K-Mart parking lot at 11:15am in Bozeman and 11:30am in Billings.
- **What time do I pick up my child at Clydehurst Saturday morning if he/she is not riding the bus?** You need to pick your child up at camp no later than 9am.
- **Can I mail letters or packages to my child while at camp?** Yes, you are more than welcome to send letters and care packages. Please follow the instructions listed on page 3.
- **How do I get lost items returned from camp?** If we can find your child's lost item, we will return the item at a charge of \$7.50 for shipping and handling. Please follow the instructions within the Youth Camp page.
- **When does registration start on Sunday?** Registration for both Youth and Family Camp is from 3 to 5pm. Please contact us if you know that you will be arriving late.
- **Do I have to pay a deposit for youth camp?** Yes, the deposit for Youth Camp is \$50 and is required with the submitted registration form. Deduct this amount from the total camp fees.
- **Do I have to pay a deposit for Family Camp?** Yes, the deposit for Family Camp is \$250 and is required with the submitted registration form. Deduct this amount from the total camp fees.
- **Can I send medication to camp along with my child?** Yes, your child can bring his/her medication. Be sure to follow the instructions on the Health and Liability release form.
- **Can I pay with a credit card?** Yes, we now accept credit cards. Please call the office to make payments. We still accept checks or money orders, but US funds only please.
- **Can I register online?** At time of brochure publication we are in the process of making online registration possible. Please check our website for future updates.
- **What do I need to bring for camp?** Please see the list "Things to Bring" within the Youth and Family Camp pages.
- **Can I register for youth camp after June 1st?** Yes. Most likely there will be youth camp openings after June 1st. Call ahead to check for openings.
- **How much do horse rides cost?** Horse rides cost \$20/hr., (shorter rides available).
- **How much spending money should I send with my child?** \$40-80 should be adequate for snacks, a shirt and a horse ride.

Family Camp Information

What comes to mind when you think of camping? Tall pine trees near a clear mountain river teeming with trout? What about hiking rugged terrain or riding horseback along flower-strewn fields. Or do you envision searching for just the right patch of ground, pitching a tent or two, gathering wood for the fire, coaxing a flame to survive just long enough to cook a meal, then scrubbing a blackened pan for hours.

Now picture that first scene with an alternate ending: Spend Sunday afternoon driving up the Boulder River Canyon to Clydehurst, pull up to the Welcome Center, register then move into your cabin. Explore the campgrounds until dinner where you will join families from all over the nation who are served a buffet dinner with the expectation to leave the dishes. Afterwards, gather for an evening service and head to the dining hall for snacks or weather permitting, meet for a moonlight hayride.

This last story really happens five summer Sundays in Montana's Gallatin National Forest, surrounded by the pristine Absoroka-Beartooth Wilderness. The best part? There's a whole week ahead full of relaxation and activities to suit any family! Couples can get away for much-needed time together while our college-aged staff provides free childcare at almost any time. Relax in the heated pool or read one of those books you've been meaning to. Clydehurst strives to offer activities in which either families or individuals can participate. We have a paintball course, archery range, rifle range with skeet shooting, fenced outdoor basketball court and optional week-long competitions in volleyball, horseshoes, and ping-pong tournaments. Just across the road we've got some of the nations best fly fishing as well!

Meals during the week include cookouts and a steak fry, always served by a cheerful staff. For teens and adults, morning and evening chapels provide inspiring music and worship combined with fresh and solid Bible teaching by a reputable pastor or speaker. At the same time, children attend a chapel just for them taught by our college-aged staff.

Accommodations

Real log cabins and buildings contribute to Clydehurst's rustic charm and include a centrally located lodge with pool tables, air hockey, and ping pong tables. The Lodge also houses a shirt shop Clydehurst Outfitters, a snack shop called the Hunger Hut, and our very own coffee shop, The Front Porch.

A cozy chapel with the river nearby provides an amazing atmosphere for growth. Our modern kitchen and dining hall provides three meals daily including sack lunches by request for hikes and family outings. The camp Laundromat provides coin-operated machines for your convenience.

Each cabin is equipped with a queen sized bed and a set of single bunks (more can be added if needed). Bedding is not provided. All cabins have hot and cold running water as well as bathing and toilet facilities under the same roof. Many have private baths, though some are duplexes and have shared baths. Cabins are determined first by postmark, with requests honored as much as possible. Family size and special needs are taken into consideration. Additional restroom and shower facilities are located in the dining hall.

There is no cell service, however a phone is available with use of a calling card and WiFi is available in the Dining Hall.

Registration Information

Pre-register for any camp by completing the form in this brochure or downloading one from our website. Forms can be mailed with a \$250.00 check or money order (not refundable after March 1, 2012) to the address on the form. *Please use one form per family.* We only accept registration forms via mail postmarked no sooner than January 3rd, 2012. **Any registration with a postmark prior to this date will be returned.**

Camp registration starts no earlier than 3:00 and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday. Camp officially begins with the evening meal at 5:30 and ends with breakfast on the following Saturday.

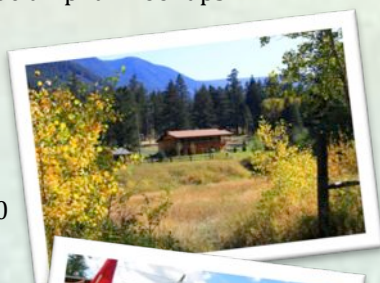

In the off-season Clydehurst opens its doors to groups for purposes of family reunions, retreats, or conferences. The weather may be changing but the scenery is still picture perfect. If you're looking for that great place to get away with a group without the distractions of the everyday grind, then this is the place for you.

Accommodations

The facilities at Clydehurst include a dining hall where meals are served and where most groups choose to hold their meetings. If weather still permits, you can make use of the chapel for your meetings. The lodge is a great place to relax or partake in games like pool, ping-pong, and air hockey. The cabins are rustic with wood stoves for heating. Some cabins are ideal for small groups or we can accommodate large groups in our all-weather 5-plex. Rifle Range, Archery, Campfire, Hiking Fishing, Hayrides, Basketball, Horseshoes, Volleyball, Game Room and Frisbee Golf are also available.

(With the exception of our 5-Plex and Dining Hall)
- Our 5-plex provides winterized housing for up to 40 people.
- Bedding is not provided.
- Special diets are the responsibility of the individual(s).
- Fees for guests with camper trailers will be the regular price if cabins are available.
- No cell service, please bring a phone card.
- We are a smoke and alcohol free facility.
